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Yachats Emergency Preparedness Committee 2022 Goals

1. Develop working relationship with Community volunteers, City Manager, and Council
2. Remove decrepit YRFPD conex from cemetery, clear plot, replace with new conex
3. Refresh contents of North and South storage containers by September 2022
4. Investigate possibility of using Cape Ranch Road for south cache.
5. Fulfill certification requirements by conducting a tabletop exercise **(CRE22 ttx – June)**.
6. Fulfill certification requirements by conducting Community Preparedness Fair June 4-5 – Include Tsunami Walk
7. Develop use of Google Drive (or investigate other means) to store EPC related materials
8. Review the Emergency Operations Plan and update as needed.
9. Review the Yachats Natural Hazard Mitigation Plan and update as needed.
10. Update list of City Staff and City Volunteers who have completed FEMA/NIMS training
11. **(Wishful thinking – 2023?)** Conduct MYN – promote neighborhood cache
